As Utah Heritage Foundation hosts its eighth annual Preservation Conference, *Hiding in Plain Sight: Places Rediscovered*, we are taking a look at the things you see every day that might be taken for granted, or lost, if we don't recognize their importance. It's the architecture that is forgotten that sometimes holds the greatest stories. Our Keynote Speaker, Charles Belfoure, wrote his first novel, *The Paris Architect*, taking history and combining that with a story of an architect who is asked to design spaces to hide people during World War II. Our featured speaker, Stuart Burgess, is the brains behind Mojave Underground, a group of explorers that ventures into ghost towns and mines to discover the history and secrets that they hold. He has written architectural histories including being the co-author of *The Baltimore Rowhouse* and *Niernsee & Neilson, Architects of Baltimore*, the author of *Monuments to Money: The Architecture of American Banks*, and *Edmund Lind, Anglo-American Architect of Baltimore and the South*. His books have won awards from the Maryland Historical Trust. *The Paris Architect* is his first novel.
